WHEREAS, Walking Horse Trail is contained within the recorded platted boundaries of the Arcadian Springs Subdivision and such plat has been previously approved by the Anderson County Regional Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, the original developer abandoned the construction of the subdivision leaving substantial road and storm water work unfinished forcing the County Planning Commission and the Department of Public Works (now operating as the Office of Planning and Development) to declare default and cash performance bonds in order to complete the required work; and

WHEREAS, forfeited funds released to the Public Works Department were utilized in their entirety to finish required road and storm water work but were insufficient to complete construction of Walking Horse Trail; therefore, leaving the substandard public way outside of the county road list; and

WHEREAS, the County Legislative Body has never accepted the road as a county road and never taken the road into the county road system, thus leaving area residents with a substandard roadway incapable of routine maintenance afforded to other official county roads by the County Highway Department; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 54-7-202 (d) the county governing body has the authority to authorize the county road department to perform work for other governmental entities; provided, that the cost of the projects so authorized are reimbursed to the county road department.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Anderson County Legislative Body meeting in regular session this 17th day of June 2019 that we authorize the Highway Department to work for the Building Commissioner and the Office of Planning and Development to perform and complete all work required by the Planning Commission, Building Commissioner and Office of Planning and Development to achieve compliance with County Subdivision Regulations, specifically county road construction standards and Storm Water mandates in order to complete all required public work necessary to authorize the County Legislative Body to accept Walking

Α

Horse Trail as an official county road capable of future road maintenance and the issuance of building permits.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Building Commissioner and the Office of Planning and Development shall monitor such required public work to ensure all aspects of county regulations are complied with including the proper placement of the road commensurate with the recorded plat previously authorized by the Planning Commission and assurance that all work is being performed within the platted county right of way. When the required work is finished to the <u>satisfaction</u> and standards of the <u>Highway Superintendent</u>, Building Commissioner and the Office of Planning and Development, the Highway Department will submit all invoices and receipts to the Finance Department for full and complete reimbursement from funds properly appropriated by the county legislative body.
