



Anderson County understands and accepts that the USDA Rural Development loan funds will be utilized first on this project and by approval of this Resolution certifies that the Board of Commissioners are agreeable to the terms set forth and accept stated funds in the amount of one hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000) on a thirty-eight (38) year term at three point three, seven, five percent (3.3750 %) interest and payable in monthly installments.

RESOLUTION TO REDESIGNATE, REAPPROPRIATE AND RECLASSIFY CERTAIN STATE REVENUES RECEIVED VIA WHOLESALE BEER TAX, LOCAL BEER TAX AND HALL INCOME TAX FROM THE COUNTY GENERAL PURPOSE SCHOOL FUND TO THE COUNTY GENERAL FUND

WHEREAS, for several years Anderson County has transferred state revenues received from the Wholesale Beer Tax, Local Beer Tax and Hall Income Tax to the Anderson County General Purpose School Fund without concern from state auditors; and

WHEREAS, the State Comptroller and the Division of County Audit have now taken the position that the identified state revenues received by Anderson County should not be transferred to the General Purpose School Fund, but retained in the County General Fund and that the lost revenues to the School Fund be offset and replaced with state revenue sharing funds generated by Tennessee Valley Authority payments; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners wishes to comply with state auditing policies and standards, correct this deficiency and transfer funds from Tennessee Valley Authority state revenue sharing funds to the General Purpose School Fund to offset the loss of revenue from the Wholesale Beer Tax, Local Beer Tax and Hall Income Tax.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Anderson County Board of Commissioners meeting in regular session this 21<sup>st</sup> day of May 2012 that the following corrective actions be instituted by the Anderson County Accounts and Budget Director and County Trustee:

SECTION 1: Henceforth, the County General Fund shall receive all revenues generated and received from the Wholesale Beer Tax (Current Account No: 141-40330), Local Beer Tax (Current Account No: 141-46830) and Hall Income Tax (Current Account No: 141-46820).

SECTION 2: The General Purpose School Fund shall receive state shared revenues generated by Tennessee Valley Authority payments (Current Account No: 101-46851) in an amount determined each year by the Board of Commissioners as necessary to offset revenues lost from the proceeds of the Wholesale Beer Tax, Local Beer Tax and Hall Income Tax.

SECTION 3: The Accounts and Budget Director and County Trustee shall make all corrections needed to the official books of Anderson County to effectuate the intent of this Resolution including the redesignation, reappropriations and reclassification of accounts.

SECTION 4: Any prior Resolution in conflict with this Resolution is immediately repealed only to the extent the conflict exists.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, this Resolution shall take effect immediately the public welfare requiring same.
