RESOLUTION REQUESTING INFORMATION FROM THE TENNESSEE VALLEY AUTHORITY RELATED TO THE BULL RUN FOSSIL FUEL PLANT CLOSURE

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) has announced plans to close the Bull Run Fossil Fuel Plant by 2023; and

WHEREAS, this plant has been the source of employment for several hundred employees over its decades of existence. The loss of this plant will have a significant impact on the economy of Anderson County as well as the numerous citizens working and residing in the surrounding community; and

WHEREAS, the Edgemoor Road development corridor has tremendous growth potential for both residential and commercial endeavors and the need to protect this area, the workers and the citizens living nearby is paramount to the Anderson County Board of Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, Anderson County and TVA have enjoyed a positive partnership for many decades and we hope that partnership will continue for many years into the future, however, we are now respectfully requesting a free flow of information related to the closure of Bull Run consisting of not only private meetings with county officials but public meetings with area citizens to dispel the many rumors and educate the general public regarding the plant closure.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Anderson County Board of Commissioners meeting in regular session this 20th day of May 2019 that we respectfully request TVA to meet with county officials and the citizens of Anderson County to share information concerning the Bull Run closure for the benefit of the health, safety and welfare of the surrounding community.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we respectfully request no additional land be acquired, or existing land be enlarged, in the Claxton Community for ash storage facilities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we respectfully request answers and guidance as to the following preliminary concerns and questions in order to educate this Body and the citizens we serve:

- 1) Does a timeline exist for the step-down and future closure of the Bull Run Facility?
- 2) Will the facility be totally decommissioned, or will it be converted to another clean-energy production facility?
- 3) What plans are in place for the future of the current workforce?

- 4) Will the building, smokestacks and transmission towers remain if the facility is totally abandoned?
- 5) Will the ash be relocated? If so, what methods will be utilized to ensure the health of the workers and public while relocating the material to other suitable out-of-county locations?
- 6) If the ash remains, will it be encapsulated and safe for current and future generations?
- 7) Is the ash safe in its current state to area residents including drinking water and recreation activities and enthusiasts?
- 8) Can the ash be repurposed for other products on or off site?
- 9) If the site is abandoned can it be redeveloped or reindustrialized for other purposes?
- 10) What techniques can be utilized to ensure the stability of the current dykes, ash ponds and impoundments?
- 11) Will the decommissioned site remain in the hands of TVA or can ownership be transferred to other public or private entities?
- 12) What will the site look like in 2025?

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Anderson County Board of Commissioners hopes that TVA will accept our invitation to meet with county officials and, at some point entertain the idea of meeting with area residents and concerned citizens. Our desire is to mutually achieve a consistent and beneficial information exchange, see the safe and efficient decommission of the plant while protecting the future of Anderson County and the health, safety and welfare for all involved.
