WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, § 5-20-102, allows the County Legislative Body to adopt standard and common building codes by reference, and

WHEREAS, Anderson County currently operates under and enforces the 2003 Edition of the International Building Code, and

WHEREAS, the *International Building Code* has been revised and updated, and the state of Tennessee has adopted the 2009 Edition of the International Building Code and the 2006 Edition of the International Energy Conservation Code, and

WHEREAS, Rules of Tennessee Department of Commerce and Insurance Division of Fire Protection § 0780-02-02-.05 states no city, county, town, municipal corporation, metropolitan government, or political subdivision of this State shall adopt or enforce any ordinance prescribing less stringent standards of fire prevention, fire protection, or building construction safety, and

WHEREAS, Anderson County wishes to repeal the 2003 Edition of the International Building Code as the official Building Code of Anderson County, and adopt the 2009 Edition of the International Building Code and the 2006 Edition of the International Energy Conservation Code as the official building code of Anderson County. This code shall apply to all structures governed by the Anderson County Zoning Resolution and under the jurisdiction of the Anderson County Building Commissioner, and

WHEREAS, the Anderson County Legislative Body desires to adopt the 2006 Edition of the International Energy Conservation Code and the 2009 Edition of the International Building Code, including the, Residential Code, Commercial Building Code, Plumbing Code, Fuel Gas Code, Mechanical Code, Existing Building Code, Property Maintenance Code and certain specifically identified appendices to each of the aforementioned codes ("the International Building Code and Appendices"). Chapter 27 of the International Building Code, entitled, "Electrical" and Section R313 of the International Residential Code entitled, "Automatic Fire Sprinklers" shall not be adopted, and

WHEREAS, the Anderson County Building Commissioner and staff, with the assistance of the County Law Director when requested, as authorized under T.C.A. § 5-20-104, shall be charged with enforcement of these codes, and

WHEREAS, the 2009 Edition of the International Building Code and the 2006 Edition of the International Energy Conservation Code has been on file with the Anderson County Clerk since November 8, 2010, and has been available since that date for public inspection and copying as required by law, and

**NOW THEREFORE**, be it resolved by the Anderson County Legislative Body meeting in regular session this 21st day of March 2011 in Clinton, Tennessee that:

Section 1: Adoption of International Building Code, and Certain Appendixes. Pursuant to the legal authority granted by T.C.A. §§ 5-20-101 et seq. the Anderson County Legislative Body does hereby adopt the 2006 Edition of the International Energy Conservation Code and the 2009 Edition of the International Building Code by reference to include the following sections:

- A) <u>International Residential Code</u>, except Section R313 "Automatic Sprinklers" but including:
  - 1) Appendix E, Manufactured Housing Used as Dwellings
  - 2) Appendix F, Radon Control Methods
  - 3) Appendix G, Swimming Pools, Spas and Hot Tubs
  - 4) Appendix H, Patio Covers
  - 5) Appendix J, Existing Buildings and Structures
- B) <u>International Commercial Building Code</u>, except Chapter 27 "Electrical" but including:
  - 1) Appendix C, Group U Agricultural Buildings
  - 2) Appendix E, Supplementary Accessibility Requirements
  - 3) Appendix F, Rodent Proofing
  - 4) Appendix G, Flood Resistant Construction.
- C) <u>International Plumbing Code</u>, including:
  - 1) Appendix B, Rates of Rainfall for various cities
  - 2) Appendix C, Gray Water Recycling Systems
  - 3) Appendix D, Degree Day and Design Temperatures
  - 4) Appendix E, Sizing of Water Piping System
  - 5) Appendix F, Structural Safety
  - 6) Appendix G. Vacuum Drainage System

- D) International Fuel/Gas Code
- E) <u>International Mechanical Code</u>, including:
  - 1) Appendix A, Combustion Air Openings and Chimney Connector Pass-throughs.
- F) <u>International Existing Building Code</u>
- G) <u>International Property Maintenance Code, except the following sections:</u> 302.4, 302.8, 303.2, 304.2, 304.14, 304.18.1, 304.18.2 and 304.18.3

#### Section 2: Building Permit Fees

In order to determine building permit fees the following charts and tables are adopted:

- A. <u>Square Foot Construction Costs</u>, published in the August 2010 edition of the *Building Safety Journal*. (Exhibit 1)
- B. <u>Building Permit Fee Chart</u>, Adopted by the Anderson County Legislative Body. (Exhibit 2)

#### Section 3: Publish and Record in Minutes

The Anderson County Clerk is hereby directed to cause this Resolution to be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the county and further printed in the minutes of the Anderson County Legislative Body. Three (3) copies of the 2006 Edition of the International Energy Conservation Code and the 2009 Edition of the International Building Code shall remain in the Clerk's official records for public review.

#### Section 4: Enforcement

The Anderson County Building Commissioner and his appointed staff shall be empowered to enforce the administration of this Code with the assistance of the County Law Director, when requested.

#### Section 5: No Retroactive Application

Nothing in this Resolution or in the *International Building Code*, thereby adopted within, shall be construed to affect any lawsuit or legal proceeding pending before any Court, Board of Zoning Appeals, Planning Commission or the Anderson County Legislative Body, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any past or present case as of the effective date of this Resolution.

#### Section 6: Repeal of the 2003 International Building Code

The 2003 Edition of the International Building Code is hereby repealed as the official building Code of Anderson County.

#### **Section 7:** Supercede Prior Resolutions

If any prior resolution or regulation of Anderson County is in conflict with this Resolution, this Resolution shall supersede any other prior resolution or regulation enacted by Anderson County, with the exception of the *Anderson County Zoning Resolution*. If the *Anderson County Zoning Resolution* is determined to be in conflict with this Resolution, then the *Anderson County Zoning Resolution* shall supersede and control.


#### Section 8: Severability

# Anderson County, Tennessee FIRE COMMISSION BYLAWS

I. Organizational Name

This committee of Anderson County Government shall be known as the "Anderson County Fire Commission."

II. Mission

It is the declared mission of the Anderson County Fire Commission to improve emergency services to Anderson County residents by working together to coordinate training opportunities, ensure equipment interoperability, establish relationships, to enhance mutual aid with all emergency response agencies in Anderson and surrounding counties, and present to the Anderson County Legislative Body issues concerning future development of emergency response in Anderson County.

#### III. Membership

A. Agency Membership (Voting Status) shall be comprised of the following:

Andersonville Volunteer Fire Department;

Briceville Volunteer Fire Department;

Claxton Volunteer Fire Department;

Marlow Volunteer Fire Department;

Medford Volunteer Fire Department;

Anderson County Rescue Squad;

Clinton Fire Department;

Lake City Fire Department;

Norris Public Safety;

Oak Ridge Fire Department;

Oliver Springs Fire Department; and

Two sitting Anderson County Commission representatives appointed by the Anderson County Legislative Body.

B. Associate Members (Non-Voting Status) shall be:

Anderson County Emergency Management;

Anderson County Emergency Medical Service;

Anderson County Sheriff's Office; and

American Red Cross

#### IV. Voting Rights

- A. Each member agency shall have one vote.
- B. The Chief of each fire department has priority voting status for his/her agency; however, the Chief may appoint a designee to cast the agency's vote on any matter. The Chief shall submit

a list of designees in order of priority that can vote in his/her absence for their respective agency. The list may be amended by the Chief at any time, but must be submitted in advance and maintained by the Fire Commission Secretary. In the Chief's absence, the appointed designee shall cast the member agency's vote on any matter brought before the Fire Commission.

- C. Associate Members shall not vote.
- D. The Chair and Vice-Chair shall be allowed to vote on any matter coming before the Fire Commission.
- E. A quorum is considered a majority of the Fire Commission voting membership and all measures shall pass by a majority of the membership present at the meeting. Members shall abstain for cause for matters that involve a direct personal benefit.

#### V. Membership Terms

- A. Department Chiefs shall serve throughout their term of office.
- B. County Commissioners shall be appointed by the Anderson County Legislative Body to serve a two (2) year term, with the Legislative Body filling any vacancy as may occur.

#### VI. Officers

A. Officers of the Anderson County Fire Commission shall be:

Chair:

County Commissioner

Vice-Chair:

Fire Chief

Secretary:

Fire Chief

B. Officers Responsibilities:

- 1) <u>Chair</u>: The Chair shall conduct the meetings, set the agenda and report to the County Commission on meeting outcomes. The agenda shall be comprised of input from Fire Commission Membership and published to Membership three days in advance of the meeting date.
- 2) <u>Vice-Chair</u>: The Vice-Chair shall conduct the meetings in the absence of the Chair. The Vice-Chair shall serve in any other capacity as directed by the Chair.
- 3) <u>Secretary</u>: The Secretary shall prepare for publication to the Membership and County Commission minutes of all meetings. The Secretary shall also prepare other correspondence including meeting agendas and public notices of meeting dates as directed by the Chair.

#### VII. Election of Officers

- A. Officers shall be elected in September of each year.
- B. In the event a vacancy occurs in one of the commission representative appointments, the County Legislative Body shall elect a qualified Member to serve the remaining term of office.

#### VIII. Meetings

- A. Meetings shall be held on the first Tuesday of January, March, May, July, September and November at 6:30 PM at the Anderson County Courthouse, or other designated location. The meetings shall be limited in length to ninety (90) minutes. Meeting time length may be extended by majority vote during the meeting. Meeting agenda requests must be submitted to the Chair by noon on the second Wednesday in each month a meeting is held.
- B. All regular meeting shall be publicly noticed in a newspaper of general circulation in the county at least five (5) days prior to the meeting date.
- C. The Fire Commission may vote to call additional special called meetings to discuss and vote on timely issues, with all Members and the public notified at least five (5) days in advance of such called meetings.

#### IX. Reports/Requests to County Commission

- A. Any issue brought to the Anderson County Legislative Body by an Anderson County Fire Commission Member shall be heard in advance and approved by vote of the Fire Commission Membership if said issue affects more than one Member Department.
- B. Any Fire Commission Member may address County Commission regarding issues affecting only that Member's individual department, provided that the issue does not involve county monetary appropriation or in-kind contribution. All requests for county funding or in-kind contributions shall be brought before the Fire Commission for approval.

#### X. Robert's Rules of Order

The most recent edition of Robert's Rules of Order shall govern any issue not covered by these Bylaws.
